

Call for papers



Dry-stone: tool and challenge for the future



The city of Krems and the regions of Wachau and Langenlois are delighted to be hosting the 19th International Dry Stone Congress. Held every two years in a new country, this event has been organised by various European and North African partners (in Greece, Italy, France, Spain, Switzerland, the United Kingdom, Morocco and Croatia) and has always attracted a large audience, including people from the Middle East, the United States and Australia. The aims of the congresses are to disseminate knowledge of dry-stone construction as a traditional art, to develop and conduct research and practical work in this field, and to facilitate the exchange of experience concerning good practice in the construction, maintenance and development of dry-stone structures.

These objectives are of interest for specialists and actors of:

- the research in anthropology, history, geography, agronomy, earth and natural sciences, architecture and engineering,
- the application of the technique to all constructions and to town and country planning,
- the study and enhancement of built heritage, landscapes, natural and cultural environment,
- the development of green and/or cultural tourism,
- the training of craftsmen and advising of dry-stone users.

The scientific and technical field covered by these different approaches is very broad and offers several angles of attack.

This year, the committee is proposing to look to the future by focusing on education and training (how and when to raise awareness among young people and the public, train apprentices and qualify professionals) and on terrace crops and products, those 'edible' walls that also help to moderate the climate. These particular themes are well-suited to the Krems area, which has a past and is preparing a future in wine production, and which improves a renewed and dynamic tradition of teaching dry-stone construction.

For 2025 the presentation and papers are divided into four subject areas:

- 1. Impacts from UNESCO inscriptions, members' actions and innovations
- 2. **Didactics & training**: raising awareness, heritage enhancement, professionalization
- 3. Terraced landscapes edible terraces: old and new crops, products and uses.
- 4. **Preservation & restoration** of structures and landscapes: theories and realities

Please send us your registrations together with your proposals for papers by the 31 March 2025. Entries only (no paper proposal) are accepted until the 31st of July 2025.

Proposals for papers: These should be sent per email to the S.P.S secretariat by the 31 March 2025 in English or French. We need the title of your paper or poster and an abstract of 400 to 800 words (approximately one page in 12-point font and double-spaced). If you are proposing posters, please allow 2 x A0, i.e. two 84 x 120 cm panels. The organising committee will confirm acceptance of proposals before mid-June 2025.

Accommodation:

The congress organisers are offering five different types of accommodation. One is directly on the event site (Krems wine school), two are within walking distance (guest houses in wine estates), and for the other two, transport to and from the congress will be provided (Langenlois gardening school, Kittenberger chalets).

Reservations, payment and invoicing for these five venues will be handled by the conference team. Reservations can be made immediately when registering online; if a place is full and no longer available, we will inform you. Breakfast is included in all places.

The aim is to have as many participants as possible close by to avoid unnecessary travel: so check who among your friends, partners or work colleagues in your field is also taking part in the congress and remember to book a double room. It is advisable to book as early as possible, and in any case before May 2025.



The Dry-Stone Walling School Austria

The local congress organiser 2025 is an associative organisation founded by:

- Wine school Krems (vocational training school for skilled workers and masters in viticulture and oenology; offering also adult education and a wine management college).
- Construction business Academy of Lower Austria (advanced training center of the construction guild and part of the apprentice educating).
- Horticultural school Langenlois (skilled workers and masters in gardening and landscaping);

In Austria, due to lack of time and structural changes at family wineries, the art of DSW has nearly been lost or performed in a technically disputable way for the last decades of the 20th century. A project in 2003 aimed at both training young multipliers for safeguarding the art and at raising awareness for its advantages. For the first 20 years as a loose working group of trainers and enthusiasts and since 2023 as an official institution, the DSW school has been offering 3-days basic trainings, 14-days courses and special workshops – the Stein & Wein festival being the annual highlight. There are no research or study activities but children's workshops, exhibitions and lectures aiming at reaching as many people and institutions as possible. By the end of 2024, 3497 people have attended 277 training courses.

International Scientific Society for the Multidisciplinary Study of Dry Stone

The Society brings together scientists, amateurs and institutions working for the study, protection and conservation of dry-stone constructions. The first international congress on the subject was held in Bari (Italy) in 1988. These meetings, which were initially informal, gradually became the expression of a common desire, which culminated in the official creation of the SPS in 1998. The aim of the Society is to ensure the continuity of these conferences and to keep abreast of developments in dry-stone research, rehabilitation and innovation. It analyses the various issues and gives its opinion on the relevance of the methods used and the objectives pursued by the various players. Through its work, it maintains links between the various partners and ensures the continuity of meetings and exchanges. International conferences have been held regularly every two years since 1988.
